



Fort View Apartments & Casey Trees Community Tree Planting Program



Washington, DC-- On October 8, 2011, Casey Trees and the staff and residents of Fort View Apartments worked together to plant new trees on the property. Casey Trees brought an impressive operation with professional staff, team leaders tents, donated breakfast and coffee and a supply of trees from reputable nearby nurseries. About 25 volunteer residents and volunteers through Casey Trees took part in the event and assisted in planting the 13 new native trees.

- o Two multi-stem River Birch Trees on each side of the entrance
- o Two Magnolias Trees
- o Eight Hawthorn Trees in front of the buildings
- o One Sumac Tree on the Fort Stevens Drive

Established in 2005, Casey Trees' flagship Community Tree Planting (CTP) program is a grassroots approach to planting trees in neighborhoods across the District. Casey Trees works to restore, enhance, and protect the tree canopy of the nation's capital. Individuals and groups interested in adding trees – ten or more – to their apartment complex, school, church, park, synagogue, or even private yard may apply.
